TOURNAMENT FORMAT

This is a high school eligibility tournament.

17U Division: Three game guarantee. Two pool games and at least one single elimination bracket game. The 17U Division consists of 33 teams in a Open Pool Division. First and second place will advance to a single elimination Gold Championship Bracket. Third place teams from each of the 17U Pools will advance to their own single elimination Silver Championship Bracket.

16U Division and 15U Division: Four game guarantee. Three pool games and at least one single elimination bracket game. All teams in each division advance to their own single elimination Championship Bracket.

PLAYING RULES

1. National High School Federation rules will be followed with the few exceptions listed below.
2. Each player will be allowed a total of six (6) fouls before being disqualified.
3. All games will be played in two (2) sixteen (16) minute halves. Overtime is in 3 minute periods.
4. There will be a three (3) minute break between halves.
5. Teams will be allowed to call two (2) full timeouts and one twenty (20) second timeout during the regulation game. One additional twenty (20) second timeout is added for overtime
6. There will be a minimum of a four (4) minute warm-up period between games.
7. No game will begin before the time listed on the official game schedule.
8. Players are allowed to play for one team only. The first team a player plays for is his official team. If a player participates for any other team, that team will forfeit the game(s).
9. All players must have high school eligibility remaining or going into their first year of prep school. Any violation will result in forfeiture of games.
10. All players must be legal residents of the state in which their team is located or be a legal resident of a geographical adjoining state. No more than three (3) players from adjoining states may be on a team's roster. Any violation will result in forfeiture of games.
11. In pool play, the team listed first is the home team and will wear light colored jerseys. In bracket play, the home team is listed first in the game numbers schedule and will wear light colored jerseys.
12. Final pool standings are determined by win-loss records within the same pool. Tie breaking procedures are: 1) Head to head competition in a two way tie 2) Point differential in all pool games with a maximum of twenty (20). 3) Defensive points allowed in all pool games. In a three way tie, once the highest place team is determined by the process above **the sequence is repeated one step at a time** until all places are determined. If all categories do not determine the order of finish, a coin toss is utilized as a final step. Forfeits are counted as ten (10) point wins or losses.
